



EDWARD E. CONRAD

CINCINNATI, OHIO—Edward E. Conrad, Captain USN (Ret.), beloved husband of the late Margot J. Conrad; loving father of Kristin C. Boettger of Brandon, Fla., Dr. Edward E. Conrad, Jr. of Portland, Ore., and David G. Conrad of Cincinnati, Ohio; brother of Dr. Bebe C. Kennedy of St. Louis, Mo.; also survived by eight grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; and a special friend Evelyn "Dori" Fitzgerald of Florence, Ky. Captain Conrad was born in St. Louis August 2, 1914. He died in Cincinnati, Ohio, on November 4, 2004. He served two years in the Naval Reserve prior to his appointment to the Naval Academy in 1934. Upon graduation from Annapolis in 1938, he began his naval career aboard the *USS Omaha*. During World War II he served aboard three submarines. He was decorated with the Bronze Star with "V" for his actions rescuing three survivors from a ditched B-29 off the coast of Japan. His

commands after the war included the submarines *USS Dentada* & *USS Corporal*, the destroyer *USS Duncan*, the amphibious attack *USS Rockbridge*, and the command cruiser *USS Northhampton*. Conrad's shore duty was varied. It included service as the administrative aid to the Secretary of the Navy, and assignments in the Atomic Energy Commission. After retiring from active duty in 1966, he taught political science at New England College in New Hampshire. In 1969, he was appointed as academic dean of the Maine Maritime Academy, Castine. He served as dean for eight years and was named to emeritus status in 1977. Following his second retirement he became a professional pilot for ships on Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence Seaway for six seasons. His final command was of the *State of Maine* training ship for two cruises. His seagoing experience spanned 53 years. Along the way he became a licensed professional engineer in the State of Maine, a Coast Guard Master of Motor Vessels of Any Gross Tonnage, and an author. Interment will be at Arlington National Cemetery, December 30, 2004, at 9 a.m. A memorial service will be held locally on Memorial Day of next year.
